Instructions

<u>Articulastories</u> follow the fill-in-the-blank format for creating goofy stories that children love. This free subscriber download includes:

• One medial /r/ story

as well as a list of word choices for each part of speech needed.

<u>To play:</u>

Simply print out a copy of the story and word list for your selected target. To increase the number of trials in your session, have the child read the word list (single word practice).

The therapist will then begin to fill-in-the blanks of the story by asking for the appropriate part of speech and filling in the child's name. For simplicity, these are listed as "thing", "action word", or "describing word" (single word practice).

Once the story is complete, the therapist can read it aloud and then have the child read it as well (sentence practice). Many children like to go back and "fix" the story with words that may or may not be on the word list.

An additional copy can be sent home or be repeated in a later therapy session since the story changes every time.
